Assistantships for Trumpet, Horn, Trombone, Tuba

Duties:

- Brass assistantships include performing in the Graduate Brass Quintet and assisting in the respective brass studios.
- Other duties may be based upon qualifications and interests.
- Graduate Quintets are active recitalists and are expected to participate in competitions, area cultural outreach, and be area clinicians for local public school music programs
- Other assistantships may be available in academic and administrative areas

This award is renewable for a second year.

Stipend and Benefits:

The annual stipend for a .50 Graduate Assistantship is \$9398 for a nine-month appointment. In addition, the assistantship comes with fee waiver consideration and health coverage under the student health plan.

Admission qualifications:

- Completion of a Bachelor or Masters degree in music with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- Successful audition into the MM or DMA program.
